To the Board of County Commissioners Wakulla County, Florida

NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- A. Reporting Entity Wakulla County, Florida (the County) is a political subdivision of the State of Florida. It is governed by an elected Board of County Commissioners (the Board). The Board has no powers other than those expressly vested in it by State Statutes and its governmental powers cannot be delegated. The Board appoints an Administrator to administer all policies emanating from its statutory powers and authority. The Clerk of the Circuit Court, an elected official, is clerk and accountant to the Board, who is responsible for legislative and fiscal control of the County. In addition to the members of the Board, there are five elected constitutional officers: The Clerk of the Circuit Count, Property Appraiser, Tax Collector, Sheriff, and Supervisor of Elections.
- B. Basis of Accounting The Landfill Management Escrow Account (the Escrow Account) was established to comply with escrow requirements of Section 62-701.630 of the Florida Administrative Code. This rule requires the County to annually deposit funds in an escrow account for the purpose of funding the estimated landfill closure costs of the County's landfills.

The balance and activity of the Escrow Accounts are presented and reported within the County's Solid Waste Fund.

The Schedule of Activity of the Landfill Management Escrow Account is presented on the basis of cash receipts and cash disbursements, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and is only intended to present the cash balance segregated for the purpose of complying with Section 62-701.630.

C. Cash – All cash balances are held in a qualified public depository pursuant to Florida Security for Public Deposits Act Chapter 280, *Florida Statutes*. The Florida Security for Public Deposits established guidelines for qualification and participation by banks and savings associations, procedures for the administration of the collateral requirements and characteristics of eligible collateral. The Landfill Management Escrow Account is maintained as a separate depository account - #0101390 401 "Wakulla County Solid Waste" at Ameris Bank.
